

Positive Behavior Rewards

Dragon Points Dragon Rally- These occur at the end of each trimester for all students who maintain 70 or more Dragon Points.

- December-Minute to Win it
- March- Bowling Trip
- June- Mr. Softee/ Outside Games Day

Dragons of the Month- These students are chosen each month (Nov-May) by classroom teachers with input from paraprofessionals, special education teachers, special area teachers, and support teachers. These students will receive a Dragon Card, a certificate to take home, a gift card rally card (Students should write their name on the back and return it to Mr. Mahlman.), and a special item that only Dragon Card holders receive. Each month (Nov-May), 2 teachers will lead a Dragon Party for the students who were newly selected. These parties will be split into 2 groups-K-3 and 4-6. In May we will hold our annual Gift Card Raffle for students who were awarded a Dragon Card throughout the school year.

These students are chosen by their classroom teachers based on 7 areas of citizenship. Multiple students may be selected each month who exhibit the following criteria:

- Academic Effort:
 - Strive to do your best in all subjects.
 - Show improvement and a positive attitude toward learning.
- Good Behavior:
 - Follow school rules and demonstrate kindness to classmates.
 - Display good manners and respect for teachers and staff.
- Attendance and Punctuality:
 - Attend school regularly and arrive on time.
 - Limit absences and tardiness to a minimum.

- Participation:
 - Engage in classroom discussions and activities.
 - Be an attentive and active learner.
- Respect:
 - Take care of school property and belongings.
 - Help keep the school environment clean and safe.
- Kindness and Friendship:
 - Be a friend to all students.
 - Show empathy and inclusivity toward others.
- Responsibility:
 - Continue to set a positive example for other students.
 - Encourage kindness and good behavior in classmates.

Friday Focus Friday Focus Students are chosen based on a yearly schedule that allows "Focus" on a specific classroom skill. Teachers select a classroom area of focus that they notice needs improvement. This can be identified during classroom meeting time. During the time specified, students will work to correct or continue the teacher selected behavior. On "Friday Focus" days, one student from each class will be selected by their teacher and sent down to receive a prize for their hard work. This allows students who are struggling to achieve a Dragon Card the opportunity to experience success and be celebrated for skills they are working on. Some examples of skills to "Focus" on are listed below, however, this is at the discretion of the teacher and they can be creative with this.

- 1. Raising hand without calling out
- 2. Staying in your seat
- 3. Turning in homework every day
- 4. Regular classroom participation
- 5. Walking quietly in the hallway
- 6. Attendance-being present and on time
- 7. Serving as a positive role model
- 8. Act as a mentor or peer helper
- 9. Demonstrating respect for teachers
- 10. Including others
